## COMMUNITY CARE DAY-2023 PROJECT PARAMETERS

## **United Way** of Logan County



United Way of Logan County's 2023 Community Care Day will be held on FRIDAY AUGUST 25.

Because of limited resources, United Way cannot respond to all project requests submitted for completion on Community Care Day. The following shall serve as guidelines to determine the feasibility of completing requested projects.

United Way will work with existing social service providers to help distribute Project Request Forms and determine eligible recipients.

A Community Care Day project should fit into one of the following categories:

- 1. Provide help to a non-profit or community-based organization (do not have to be a United Way Funded Agency to qualify).
- 2. Provide a service that enhances the quality of life for area residents (ex. Working with local government on a park improvement project.)

Requested projects should take place in Logan County or at the site of a United Way Funded Agency (ex. If Boy Scouts requested help at their camp, which is in Clark County.)

Requested projects should be able to be completed by the team of volunteers in a single day. Ideally, projects would take between 4-6 hours to complete.

All projects will be completed by at least two Community Care Day volunteers. No one will be sent to a project alone.

Also taken into consideration will be:

The number of volunteers needed to complete the project.

The level of skill required to complete the project.

The availability and accessibility of materials and to complete the project.

The safety of volunteers.

Funding, materials, and tools for Community Care Day projects will need to come from:

- 1. The project recipient is asked to provide some or all of the necessary materials.
- 2. In-kind product donations from area businesses. (United Way does not solicit for you.)
- 3. The volunteer group doing the project.

Volunteers are typically expected to bring typical household tools and/or supplies from home to help (rakes, shovels, garden gloves, rags, etc.).

Volunteer groups could choose to fund projects or bring materials if they choose to adopt a project that requires them for completion. It would be made known well in advance that this is needed at the time of project selection.
