Camp Elim at Lac Pelletier located 52 km off of Highway #1 southwest of Swift Current, SK.

ACCOMMODATIONS

RV and Tenting Accommodations: (Camp Elim)

Directly north of the cabins are 12 sites suitable for RV's with 240v/30 amp plugins and potable water at each site, and 2 sites specifically for tenting with 100v/15 amp electricity and water. There is a septic sewage dump provided on site. The campground has a wheelchair accessible washroom building with showers. Please be aware that the campground is in a relatively open area with no natural privacy between sites. Currently, they do not supply fire pits or firewood. We ask that guests to the campground please respect the posted campground rules.

What to bring: Bedding, towels, personal toiletries, swimming gear, bug spray, appropriate shoes, flash light

Cabin Arrangements: We are happy to take requests for friends or groups who would like to be in a cabin together. We will do our best to accommodate.

SERVICE & FOOD SCHEDULE CONT.

Services:

It is expected that those that have registered for camp, would make every effort to participate in both the morning teaching session and the evening service. The lake will be closed to the water sports during the morning and evening services.

Camp Clean Up:

Everyone will need to help with the clean up of the grounds and their cabins before they leave. There will be a charge for damage to camp property.

Gratis Schedule:

To help keep the costs for camp as low as possible, it is expected that each person will participate in some form of gratis once each day. That includes cleaning or helping in the kitchen.

Dietary Restrictions:

We would endeavour to try and accommodate different dietary restrictions and allergies; but please let us know at registration so we can prepare accordingly.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Water Equipment Available: Life-jackets, Canoes, Kayaks and paddle-boards

Recreational Activities: Camp Fire Pit, Swimming, Fishing, Frisbee, Beach Volleyball, Trampoline and the regional Golf-course would be available for booking tee-times outside of service times.

Please do not bring your quads or motor-bikes to camp.

Fishing: You are welcome to bring your own fishing equipment as there will not be fishing gear provided at the camp. Fishing is not allowed near the swimming area.

Water Safety: We will not have a lifeguard on staff so children must be supervised by an adult at all times while in the water. Life jackets are mandatory for all waters-sports.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION CONT.

Boats: If you choose to bring your own water-crafts, you are welcome to do so. However, you will be responsible for the safety of those in your family that will be using these boats or devices. LSC will not be responsible for any liability issues in relation to the use of these water-crafts. If someone outside of your family wants to ride or participate in using your personal water-crafts, they will need to have written permission from their parent/guardian that is present at the camp. This can be in a form of a text but it must be in written form prior to them using or riding on the water-craft. All other safety precautions for using a water-craft as outlined in the camp rules and the provincial guidelines will also apply. That includes, each person wearing a life jacket.

Animals: Unfortunately we are not able to accommodate having dogs come to Living Springs Church family camp.

Clothing: Let modesty inspire your choice of clothing; it underlies all camp dress expectations. Teaching modesty to adolescents and young children is a way to help them honour the Lord and others in how they dress.

- T-shirts should only have positive messaging and should be long enough to cover your belly button.
- Shorts should be close to mid-thigh.
- Tank tops are welcome should they not expose cleavage both noticeable/unexpected when active.
- Ladies, one piece swim suits are recommended and a t-shirt will be required for all two piece suits. Cover up's should be worn while not on the beach.
- Guys, t-shirts should be worn when not on the beach.
