APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

- January 2023 Minutes Approval (M/S/P/A): Ariana/James/Passed/Thomas
- 1. OVERSIGHT AND ADVISORY: BSK Capital Programs Catarina Ratajczak (Program Manager) & Laurie Wells (Community Development Lead)
 - Catarina Ratajczak provided the board with an overview of the new BSK Capital Programs investment strategy.
 - Four priorities (see PPT presentation for details). Priorities were decided upon via the Best Starts for Kids 2.0 Implementation Plan
 - Priority One (7.2 million)
 - Priority 2 (2023): Renovations and repairs to existing multi-use community centers (4.7 million); will not fund family child care.
 - Priority 3: Expand child care and early learning facilities (compliment to PSTAA)
 - Priority 4: Creation of affordable family and/or youth housing
 - 2022 Letters of Interests we were sent out to help understand the needs in the community for Priorities 1 and 2. A letter of interest is not required for future participation.
 - PTSAA funding will address family child care
 - All regions of King County are eligible to participate
- 2. BOARD BUSINESS: Subcommittee Report Outs and 2023 Work Plan Priorities Nicole H.
 - **Co-Chair Priorities 2023:** Addressing issues at the youth detention facility; Authentic partnership with youth leaders; support Youth Bill of Rights; Support an update of the Youth Action Plan.
 - Young Leaders Subcommittee Continue to create space and a board culture supportive to the engagement of youth and young leaders.

- Three Investment Areas of PSTAA
 - Early Learning Facilities
 - K-12 Community-Based Supports (Love and Liberation)
 - College, Career & Technical Education (College Promise)
- Meetings Times: 4th Monday of every month from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.; will be shifting to every other month; PAS is planning a retreat in May. Most meetings are virtual.
- Community Engagement Subcommittee (see PPT presentation)
 - Purpose is to create a stronger connection between the communities of King County and the CYAB.
 - Youth Action Plan Advisory Letter, recommending the county update the plan
 - Create authentic spaces and conversations with historically underrepresented communities
 - Communicate the priorities of the CYAB
- Children & Family Justice Center Strategic Plan Advisory Committee: They are in the processes of restructuring this group and continue to address how to repurpose the youth jail.
